

SHEBOYGAN COUNTY RESOLUTION NO. 17 (2022/23)

Re: **Approving WE Energies Easement for Asphalt Plant**

WHEREAS, the Sheboygan County Transportation Department is replacing its existing asphalt plant in the Town of Greenbush, and

WHEREAS, most components of the plant require electricity to operate, including the silo, conveyor, and motor control house, among other items, and

WHEREAS, it has been determined that the most efficient and cost-effective form of power generation is by electrical service, and

WHEREAS, WE Energies is the electrical service provider for the area in which the asphalt plant is located and the Transportation Department has consulted with WE Energies to have electrical service installed between its transmission line along State Highway 23 and the asphalt plant components requiring such service, and

WHEREAS, an easement across Sheboygan County-owned property on which the asphalt is located is required, and

WHEREAS, granting such easement will be in the public interest for longevity and cost-effectiveness of the asphalt plant;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that Sheboygan County approves the distribution easement with WE Energies relating to the asphalt plant.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Sheboygan County Board Chairperson and the County Clerk be authorized to sign said easement on behalf of Sheboygan County.
