MARRIAGE APPLICATION CHECKLIST

Wedding arrangements: <u>Must</u> be finalized prior to applying for your license: Your wedding date; know the municipality where marriage is taking place (city, village or township); name, address and phone number of your officiant; names of your two adult witnesses. A marriage application must be made no more than 60 days but not less than 3 days prior to the wedding day by appointment only.

Make an appointment: To apply for a marriage license please call the County Clerk's office at 920-459-3003 ASAP!

An appointment is required.

Certified birth certificate: Provide a certified birth certificate. Photo copies are not accepted. Hospital Souvenir Certificates of Birth or State Notifications of Birth Registration are not certified birth certificates.

Unexpired photo ID

Proof of residency: (if photo ID is not current) provide proof of residency such as a utility bill, pay stub, rent agreement etc.

Social Security Numbers: You do not need to bring your Social Security card.

If previously married: Please supply proof of how the marriage ended (Certified Death Certificate, Legal Annulment, or Findings & Conclusion of Final Divorce Judgment indicating the DATE the marriage ended.)

Application fee(s): \$90.00 plus **\$25.00** waiver fee if qualified to apply for a license less than 3 days prior to the wedding.

Parental Consent Form if under 18 years old

Foreign language documents must have a certified translation. Applicants who do not speak and understand English must apply with an independent interpreter not related to either applicant.


INFORMATION GUIDE

Marriageable Age: Any person who has attained the age of 18 may marry. Persons 16 or 17 years of age may marry only with written consent of parents or guardian. Consent forms must be signed in the County Clerk's office.

License Application: Both parties must apply together in-person in the County Clerk's Office. The application must be made no more than 60 days but not less than 3 days prior to the marriage date. An appointment is required. Please call 920-459-3003 as soon as possible to set an appointment, as time slots fill up fast. Do not wait to set your appointment. An \$90.00 fee is payable at the time of application. If the couple is unable to apply within the required time due to extenuating circumstances (call Clerk's office to find out extenuating circumstances), the County Clerk may waive the 3-day waiting period. The "60 days prior" requirement cannot be waived. A waiver form must be completed and an additional \$25.00 fee will be charged. Waivers will not be granted for applicants under the age of 18.

Payment: Our office accepts **only** cash or check. If you choose to use a major credit or debit card you will be sent to another office to use the card. However, there is a transaction fee for this service.

Proof of Age: Both parties are required to present a **certified birth certificate** which has a raised seal from the State or County where they were born. (Hospital Souvenir Birth Certificates and State Notification of Birth Registrations are not acceptable). If born <u>outside</u> of the U.S. we will accept a Resident Alien Card or Foreign Passport.



Unexpired Photo ID and Proof of Residency: Both parties must present unexpired photo identification (driver's license, alien card, school ID, etc.) and documentation showing a correct address for proof of residency (driver's license, rent receipt, bank account, utility bill, pay stub with address, etc.)

Social Security Numbers: Both parties must provide their SSN. It is not necessary for you to bring the actual Social Security card with you.

Ceremony: When you apply for your license we will need to know the DATE of your ceremony, the exact location WHERE (municipality) you are to be married, the NAME, ADDRESS and TELEPHONE NUMBER of the OFFICIANT performing the ceremony, and the NAMES of your two adult witnesses.

Divorce Papers/Death Certificate: If either party has been previously married, they must provide a copy of the Divorce Judgment, Legal Annulment papers or Death Certificate from their **last** marriage. If the last marriage ended in divorce, the divorce **must be final** for **at least 6 months** to remarry in Wisconsin.

Foreign Language: Documents in a foreign language must have a certified translation. Persons who do not speak and understand English must bring an independent interpreter **not related to either party** when applying for their license.

CIVIL CEREMONIES

Courthouse Ceremonies

Couples wishing to be married at the Courthouse should contact the Family Court Commissioner's office at 920-459-3102 prior to applying for the marriage license. Wedding ceremonies are performed in Room B-10 on Fridays between 3:00 p.m. and 4:00 p.m. by appointment. There is a \$45 fee for use of the courthouse payable at the time of application for marriage license in the County Clerk's Office.

Other Civil Ceremonies



Couples wishing to be married <u>outside</u> of the courthouse may be married by a **County Circuit Court Judge** or **Municipal Judge** (phone numbers listed below). Circuit Court Judges are available on a rotational basis. Fees are at the discretion of the individual judges and can range from \$175 to \$250. Sheboygan County Circuit Court Judges can be contacted through the Judicial Assistant Department of the Clerk of Circuit Courts Office at **920-459-0308**.
