Primary Responsibilities

Public Safety

The Sheriff’s Department strives to provide the highest professional level of law enforcement and corrections services to the public, preserve the peace, enforce the law, and reduce crime.

Circuit Courts

Judges preside over felony, misdemeanor, ordinance, criminal traffic, traffic, civil, family, small claims, paternity, juvenile, adoption, probate, wills, mental and guardianship cases; includes jury services and case management.

District Attorney

Prosecutes all crimes occurring within Sheboygan County on behalf of the State of Wisconsin; prosecutes all non-criminal traffic and ordinance citations on behalf of the State Patrol, the Sheriff’s Department and the Wisconsin DNR that occur within the county; and prosecutes a variety of juvenile matters.

Health & Human Services

Improves the quality of life and self-sufficiency of Sheboygan County residents facing economic crises, health risks, mental illness challenges related to child or family wellness, life changes associated with aging, and other related conditions.

Elections

The County Clerk administers the election process in Sheboygan County, coordinating all federal, state, county, municipal, and school elections.

Transportation

The Highway Department maintains roads for safe and reliable travel throughout the county year round, including county trunks, state highways and local township roads—2,186 lane miles in total.

Treasurer

Collects property taxes for the county and other taxing entities, and provides assessment, tax and real property information.

Register of Deeds

The primary source of legal documents including birth, marriage and death certificates, military records, and personal and real estate ownership and encumbrance records.

Planning, Conservation, & UW-Extension

Committed to providing sound information, education & UW research on environmental and planning issues that affect our community, and protects and enhances our natural resources.

County Administrator/Finance

Coordination of administrative and management functions of all county departments, preparation of the annual budget, and leadership to achieve our mission and vision.
